4th Graders "LOVED" it! May 23, 2023



Wanted: Trolley Manager "Wrangler"

The Williamson-Pultneyville Historical Society's historic trolley replica is in need of someone to manage it-yep, even trolleys can't do it alone.

The ideal person would have a 1 ⁷/₈ inch hitch ball, a vehicle that could tow the trolley to and from and the willingness to seek out others to pull the trolley in events. It was constructed about 20 years ago on a boat trailer, and has been pulled in the past by pickups and ordinary cars. Pomeroy Marker Designating Pultneyville Historic District to Be Dedicated July 22, 2023

In 1985 the thirty-seven-acre Pultneyville Historic District came into being as a result of years of data gathering and compilation by a small group of intrepid volunteers led by then Town Historian Chester Peters.


This national historic district at its inception included 35 properties containing 33 contributing and 18 contributing primary structures outbuildings. It encompasses the historic core of Pultneyville. Built between c.1810 and the late 1890s, the historic structures in the Pultneyville Historic District embody a variety of popular nineteenth-century American architectural styles, including Federal, Greek Revival, Italianate, and Second Empire, as well as vernacular and eclectic interpretations of these styles. Since its designation as part of the National Register of Historic Places, several of the structures are no longer present due to a variety of reasons.


The Williamson-Pultneyville Historical Society cordially invites you to be a part of the dedication and unveiling of our new Pultneyville Historic District Marker on July 22, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. in the afternoon. Acquired thanks to a grant from the William G. Pomeroy Foundation, the new marker is located at the west end of the historic district that was officially designated in 1985.

This ceremony will take place in the front lawn of the Society house, located at 4130 Mill Street in the Hamlet of Pultneyville, Town of Williamson. In case of rain the formal part of the ceremony will take place in historic Gates Hall, located just west of the Society house at 4107 Lake Road, Pultneyville. Bring your umbrellas just in case!

A Shared History

It is the pleasure of W-PHS to share the following article by George McGraw as it appeared in the History Column of the June 25, 2023 edition of *The Times of Wayne County*.

Mr. McGraw grew-up in Wayne County and today resides in Texas. In his youth he spent considerable time in Williamson with his grandfather, George Mullie, who at one time owned the Decker and Mullie Store on West Main Street and his mother, Jean, who graduated from Williamson Central School District before attending Oberlin College. His ties to our community are binding and fondly remembered.

Mr. McGraw is the great-grandson of Isaac Mullie who was a Private in Company D of the NY 111th Regiment during the War of Rebellion. Over the years he has fostered an interest in the 111th and Isaac's service in the war.

He has done much to increase awareness for and promote the 111th in Wayne County and the W-PHS is most appreciative for his continuing interest collaboration and generosity.

Do you have Civil War relatives?


Where was your great-grandfather in July 1893? Mine was in Gettysburg to mark the 30th anniversary of the great battle. Tens of thousands of aging veterans descended on the now-famous Pennsylvania town to remember what they did there over three days in July and to honor the sacrifices of those who fell never to rise again. Among the attendees were one-time members of the 111th New York Infantry Raised from the towns and villages of Wayne and Cayuga counties, the 111th was mustered into service on August 20, 1862, and the next day, over one thousand men strong, marched for the seat of war. Orders directed the men to help defend Harpers Ferry, a decision that would shape the regiment's destiny in unimaginable ways. After a humiliating surrender and then confinement at Camp Douglas, the 111th redeemed itself in blood at Gettysburg. Of the 350 men taken into battle, 246 fell as casualties, a staggering 70%.

The New Yorkers would go on to fight in every major battle in the east, from the Wilderness, Spotsylvania, Cold

Harbor, to the siege of Petersburg and the end of their war at Appomattox in April 1865. When the men returned home as heroes, just over one hundred of those who originally joined the regiment in 1862 were left in the ranks.

On a beautiful June day in 1891, veterans of the regiment gathered south of the town of Gettysburg to dedicate a monument in honor of those who fought in the battle. The stone pedestal topped with the bronze statue of a soldier was placed next to the Abraham Brian barn where the 111th battled on July 3rd. Speeches were made and pictures taken, like the one below. Today, thanks to incredible generosity of a descendant of one of the brave soldiers, a full-size replica of this memorial has been commissioned by the Wayne County Historical Society and, when complete, it will find a home in Lyons in 2024. 

With the arrival of summer many of us will be enjoying B. Forman Park, but how many of us know the history of the park? The park started as the farm of Samuel and Elizabeth Cuyler one of the early settlers of Williamson. Cuyler's house was also one of the stops on the Underground Railroad as noted by a historic marker in the park.



The house burned down in the early 20th century and the land was sold to Benjamin Forman, owner of B. Forman Co, an upscale clothing store in Rochester.

Mr. Forman opened Camp Forman in 1925 as a vacation and recreation center for his employees. The location on the lakeshore in Pultneyville was ideal with the new Rochester-Sodus Point trolley line making the destination an easy commute from Rochester (the camp had buses to transport visitors from the Williamson Station). The camp featured platform tents, beach stone cooking grills (a few still exist), cobblestone bird baths, a playhouse, and of course the white house that we are all familiar with. On a personal note, my grandparents Frank and Alice Montondo were the caretakers of the park. Grandpa Frank did the landscaping, planting the trees, tending flower beds, and mowing the lawn by hand. Grandma Alice was the cook, and the white house was a dining hall where three meals a day were served to the visitors. The Montondo family spent their summers living in the living quarters on the upper floor (an ideal life for the five siblings). When I asked where the Forman family stayed, I was told that they camped in one of the tents like the rest of the employees.


The camp was dedicated in 1925 and remained in use until the early 1950s when automobiles became widely used in the post war years.

The tulips we've planted over the last few years put on a great show this spring. There will be more bulbs planted this fall to brighten up the spring in 2024.



About the Williamson-Pultneyville Historical Society

Founded in 1964 and chartered in 1971, the mission of the Williamson-Pultneyville Historical Society is to preserve, protect and share local history of the Town of Williamson, NY, in general, and the unincorporated hamlet of Pultneyville in particular, by creating curiosity, inspiring involvement, and providing exceptional experiences by making history come alive.

The Society is located in a landmark dwelling known as the *Auchampaugh* home at 4130 Mill St. This house was built for Harvey Auchampaugh about 1858 by Russell Cole, a local blacksmith and builder. Auchampaugh was a prominent businessman in the hamlet, a harness maker, drugstore proprietor and Postmaster for several years.



Rooms in the home contain exhibits, archived information, a gift shop and business office. The Society House is regularly open mid-June through mid-October 1-4pm Friday through Sunday or by Special Appointment by calling 315.589.9892.
